

Marc Kielburger is a social entrepreneur, New York Times best-selling author and charismatic speaker, inspiring millions to improve their communities and the world through daily actions and socially conscious life choices. Marc is the cofounder, along with his brother, Craig, of Free the Children, an international charity, Me to We, an innovative social enterprise, and We Day, a signature youth empowerment event.

While working as a Page in the House of Commons, Marc was invited on a trip to Thailand to volunteer in the slums of Bangkok. After returning home he completed his post-secondary education in the U.S. and UK, and made a choice that changed his life - he moved back to Canada to help found Free the Children. Founded in 1995, Free the Children has grown into a global network of more than two million young people committed to leading social change. Through its holistic and sustainable development model, Free the Children has built more than 650 schools and school rooms in developing regions, providing education to more than 55,000 children every day. Its health and clean water initiatives have empowered more than one million beneficiaries.

Through Me to We, Marc and Craig are advancing a new vision of philanthropy that connects business to a social purpose. Every year, Me to We reaches hundreds of thousands of socially conscious consumers. It provides full-time employment to over 1,000 women artisans in Kenya, and has created a global market for their work through partnerships with leading retailers, including Nordstrom, Virgin and PacSun. Half of Me to We's annual net profit is donated to Free the Children, while the other half is reinvested to grow the enterprise and its social mission.
