

Peter Navarro received his PhD in economics from Harvard University and is a professor emeritus at The Paul Merage School of Business, University of California, Irvine. He appears regularly in such media outlets as the BBC, CNN, CNBC, MSNBC, and the CBS News, including 60 Minutes. He wrote ten books, most recently *Death by China, Seeds of Destruction*, Always a Winner, and the bestselling *The Coming China Wars*. In 2001, his *If It's Raining in Brazil, Buy Starbucks* was also a bestseller. Professor Navarro's other books include the path-breaking management book, The Well-Timed Strategy.

Professor Navarro's unique and internationally recognized expertise lies in his "big picture" application of a highly sophisticated but easily accessible macroeconomic analysis of the business environment and financial markets for investors and corporate executives.

His articles have appeared in a wide range of publications, from Business Week, the Los Angeles Times, the Boston Globe, the Chicago Tribune, the International Herald Tribune, the New York Times, and The Wall Street Journal to the Harvard Business Review, the MIT Sloan Management Review, and the Journal of Business.
