



Deion Sanders, affectionately known as Prime Time, is considered one of the most flamboyant and gifted athletes in recent American sports history and is one of the few professional athletes to excel in both baseball and football. Sanders played football for the Atlanta Falcons, San Francisco 49ers, Dallas Cowboys, Washington Redskins and Baltimore Ravens. In baseball, he played for the New York Yankees, Atlanta Braves, Cincinnati Reds and San Francisco Giants. During his 14-year NFL career, Sanders was one of the most feared pass defenders to ever play the game. His 19 defensive and return touchdowns are an NFL record. He was selected to eight Pro Bowls. He was the fifth pick overall in the 1989 NFL Draft by the Falcons, where he played until 1993. After five seasons with the Falcons, Sanders signed with the 49ers. Sanders was voted the 1994 NFL Defensive Player of the Year and recorded an interception in the 49ers 49-26 win over the San Diego Chargers in Super Bowl XXIX. After one year with the 49ers, Sanders signed with the Cowboys, where he helped the team win its third Super Bowl title in four years with a victory in Super Bowl XXX against the Pittsburgh Steelers. He is the only player in NFL history to catch a pass and make an interception in the Super Bowl. After five seasons with the Cowboys, he played one season with the Redskins and two seasons with the Ravens. Although Sanders is best remembered for his football prowess, he also enjoyed a nine-year, part-time baseball career, playing in 641 games with four teams. In 1992, his most productive year, he hit .304 and stole 26 bases in 97 games for the Braves. During the 1989 season, he hit a home run and scored a touchdown in the NFL in the same w...
